President's Corner

Hope this letter finds you in good spirits. If there is any good I can take away from the Covid-19 situation is that I have the time to tackle "honey-dos" around the house. Painting, weeding, pressure washing, stuff I have been putting off: BORING lets talk fishing.



Monday I met some club members up at Foster Lake. We were fishing one of the arms a hard left from the Sunnyside boat ramp. I was the hot guy that day. Fished a balanced leech, size 12 hook. Been using a black/blue dubbing mix, black marabou tail with some flash. Caught 7-8 rainbow stockers between 12-14 inches. The other guys didn't do as well which shows there's an element of luck in our sport.

Friday, Bill and I did the Christenson to Harrisburg run on the Willamette. Took a little creative shuttling to keep the distance protocol but it was doable. If you didn't know, Christenson Landing is across the river from Marshall Island. There were no signs prohibiting access, so off we went. Did real well Czech nymphing and indicator fishing. I use a Syndicate 3 wt. 10 ft. euro rod with a Rio sighter set up. The sighter set up has tippet rings on each end so all you do is attach one end to the leader coming from your dry line and add 4-6 ft. of 4x fluoro on the other. I usually use a heavily weighted jig fly for my point fly and 12 to 18 inches above that a smaller fly tied with a surgeons knot. What I really like is the versatility of this set up. I can Czech nymph as is, or add an indicator and fish that way. Bill, on the other hand, didn't have any luck indicator fishing but killed it fishing a dry caddis fly. Go figure!

As you probably guessed there will be no general meeting this month. The board is going to try video conferencing for our May meeting. Hopefully we can meet in June. Until then, FISH ON! Scott

Olalla Reservoir Outing May 16



If the COVID-19 pandemic abates enough to allow it, we will fish Olalla Reservoir on May 16. There is a small area to fish from shore, but the best success is from a floating device.

To get there, drive I-5 south to Exit 228, turn right onto Highway 34 and follow it around Corvallis and through Philomath, merge right onto Highway 20 and drive it about 30 miles to just past the first Toledo exit, turn right (north) onto Olalla Creek Road, and follow it about 3 miles to the reservoir.

Suggested gear is 4-6 weight rods with intermediate or Type 3 sinking line, or floating line with beadhead flies. Flies include the standard stillwater types, like woolly buggers/leeches, AP emergers, soft hackles, etc. Our target is trout, but warmwater fish are also present.

The club will not provide a meal, due to the probable social distancing, so bring a lunch as well as your PFD.

May 27—Fall River Outing

Again, if the pandemic situation will allow it, we will fish the Fall River southwest of Bend on May 27 (Wednesday).


To get there, drive Highway 20 east to Bend, get onto Highway 97 south, drive it south about 19 miles to the USFS 43 road, turn right (west) and follow USFS 43 about 13 miles to the Fall River campground.

The best public access to the river runs from the campground upriver to the headwaters and downriver to the fish hatchery. You may want to visit the Flyfishers Place website for current information and fly patterns.

Suggested gear is 4-6 weight rods with floating line. Euronymphing techniques with olive or orange perdigons and Frenchie flies have been successful. Other small nymphs can also be successful when fished near the bottom. Blue Wing Olives usually hatch and bunny duns, Barr's emergers, and other BWO dries/emergers are successful.

Unfortunately, we will not have a club sponsor for this outing but, if you have a question, feel free to contact Kent Toomb at (541)451-7610 or by e-mail at kent.toomb@gmail.com.

An alternative plan for this outing would be to camp at either South Twin Lake or at Rock Creek campground on Crane Prairie and fish Fall River on a day drive while still floating/fishing either of those waters.

Fly of the Month

The Renegade




Have you ever used a fly that is so successful that you stopped using it? The Renegade fits that description for me. When I first started fly fishing, I read that Cutthroat trout have an affinity for this pattern. Spending many days on the South Santiam river, which is full of Cutthroat, the Renegade became a staple in my fly box. The Renegade dates back to 1928 when Taylor “Beartracks” Williams, a guide in Idaho developed it. If you fish waters that hold Cutthroat, it’s worth having a few.

Recipe


Hook: Dry Fly Size 12-18
Thread: Black Uni-thread 8/0
Body: Peacock Herl (3 strands in a dubbing loop)
Tag: XS Gold Tinsel
Rear Hackle: Brown Hackle
Front Hackle: White Hackle, 1-2 sizes larger than the rear hackle.



Start your thread behind the eye and tie to where the thread would hang over the barb of the hook. Tie in the tinsel and tie it about 1/3 in to the bend of the hook. Advance the thread to the point of the hook and then wrap the tinsel forward to the thread and tie off.



Select a brown hackle and strip the far side. This will help to keep the hackle standing straight up as it is wrapped. Tie the feather in above where the barb would be.



Wrap the hackle forward to the point of the hook. Approximately 4 to 5 wraps and tie off. Select 3 strands of peacock herl and tie in and wrap back to the base of the hackle. Advance your thread to the 1/3 position behind the eye. Make touching wraps with the peacock to the thread and tie off.



Select a white hackle and strip the far side. Tie in where the peacock was tied off. Make 4 to 5 wraps of the hackle and tie off. Trim the stem of the hackle and whip finish.
